

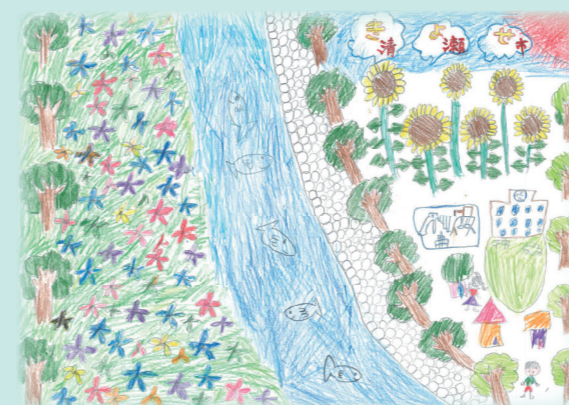

## Positioning and Characteristics of the Plan

The 5th Kiyose City Long-term Comprehensive Plan is positioned as the highest-level plan for urban development in Kiyose City. In order to promote better community development amid various regional challenges, it is important not only for the government but also for citizens, civic organizations, businesses, and other diverse local stakeholders to work together in collaboration. Therefore, this plan is not intended solely for administrative implementation; rather, it is a plan to be shared throughout the entire community. It clarifies the division of roles between the government and various stakeholders, including citizens, and is positioned as a plan for realizing the future vision of the city together.



## Structure and Duration of the 5th Kiyose City Long-term Comprehensive Plan

### 1) Structure of the 5th Kiyose City Long-term Comprehensive Plan

The 5th Kiyose City Long-term Comprehensive Plan consists of a three-tier structure: the Basic Concept, the Basic Plan, and the Implementation Plan. The purpose and time frame of each are as follows

Basic Concept	10 years	The Basic Concept presents the fundamental principles, which serve as the fundamental approach to urban development, the desired future vision, and the basic goals for city administration in each field, based on the current situation and challenges.
Basic Plan	10 years (reviewed at 5 years)	The Basic Plan outlines specific measures and directions to realize the Basic Concept.
Implementation Plan	3 years (reviewed annually)	The Implementation Plan presents the directions for promoting measures for each administrative issue, as well as specific projects and initiatives, based on the policy directions indicated in the Basic Plan.

### 2) Duration of the 5th Kiyose City Long-term Comprehensive Plan

The 5th Kiyose City Long-term Comprehensive Plan begins in the 2026 financial year, with the target year set as 10 years from this date.



## Review of the 4<sup>th</sup> Kiyose City Long-term Comprehensive Plan

### 2) Challenges

Population Decline	Natural Disasters
The population of the Kiyose City is projected to peak around 2025 and then gradually decline. The population of children and working-age people has already been decreasing, while the elderly population is expected to continue increasing until 2050, leading to a further declining birthrate and aging population. As these demographic changes will have a significant impact on the city’s future, it is necessary to promote relocation and settlement, expand the number of people with ties to the city, and utilize digital technologies in order to create a safe, secure, and vibrant community that is chosen as a place to live.	According to damage estimates by the Tokyo Metropolitan Government, it is expected that Kiyose City will experience seismic intensity levels of 6 in the event of a major earthquake directly beneath the capital. It is necessary to enhance disaster resilience by combining hard measures, such as seismic retrofitting of public facilities and residences, with soft measures, such as disaster education and training. In addition, it is important to establish a system for rapid information dissemination by utilizing multilingual support and digital technologies. Furthermore, in order to address the concentration of aging facility renewal periods and shortages of human resources, efficient maintenance and management must be promoted, and efforts should be made to create a safe and secure city.
Digitalization	Decarbonization
Amid a declining population and an increasingly aging society, utilizing digital technologies is essential for solving regional issues. In addition to streamlining administrative services at municipal offices through Digital Transformation (DX), it is also necessary to promote DX in daily life fields such as healthcare, childcare, tourism, and transportation. Reviewing conventional systems and optimizing administrative services according to future demographic structures is also required. In Kiyose City, efforts such as open data initiatives and smartphone classes for the elderly are underway, and going forward, further promotion of regional DX in collaboration with various stakeholders will be a key challenge.	Global warming is a serious environmental issue, and the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions is a common challenge worldwide. Efforts toward decarbonization are progressing in many countries, and Japan has set goals to reduce emissions by 46% by fiscal year 2030 and to achieve carbon neutrality by 2050. Kiyose City has also declared itself a “Zero Carbon City,” aiming for net-zero emissions by 2050. By reducing emissions and promoting the use of renewable energy and energy conservation through collaboration with various stakeholders, we seek to address local challenges while achieving a sustainable regional economy.

## Fundamental Principle of Urban Development

The fundamental principle outlines the future vision for the entire region and expresses the basic approach to community development. In Kiyose City, the fundamental principle is established as follows, based on the voices of citizens and others involved with the city.



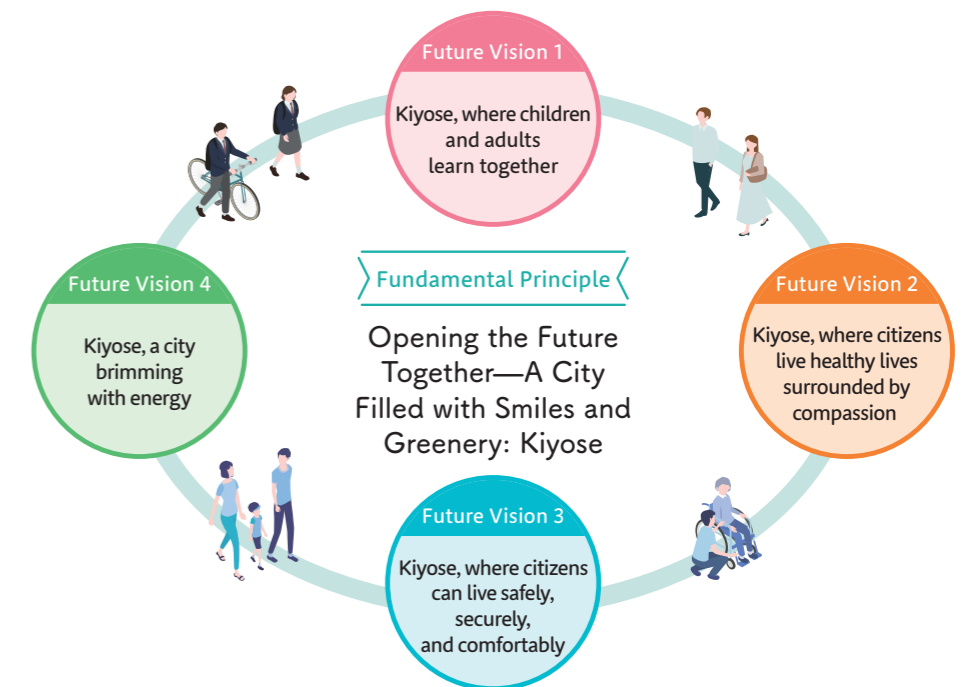

#### [Fundamental Goal 11]

##### Building a society that supports children's growth

To realize a society that protects the rights of children, it is important to create an environment where children can grow up with peace of mind and where people can feel secure about giving birth and raising their children. Therefore, we will provide seamless support throughout the community by enhancing services for children and child-rearing households, and by strengthening consultation systems related to child-rearing.
